Medicaid Protection

Medicaid Protection was put in place at the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic and provided continued Medicaid coverage for individuals who may have otherwise been ineligible. Congress has recently passed a bill that ends this continued coverage requirement on April 1, 2023.

This does not mean your customers' Medicaid coverage will automatically end on April 1, 2023, even if they are receiving Medicaid as a result of this special protection.

DHW will send notices to customers telling them about any coming changes in their eligibility or benefits, and if they need to complete a re-evaluation.

Speech, Language, and Hearing Providers

During recent audits, Medicaid Program Integrity Unit has identified independent speech providers incorrectly billing with multiple units of service. Most independent speech therapy services should be billed with one unit per visit or session. It is the provider's responsibility to ensure accurate billing.

Section 2.6 of the January 2020 Medicaid Provider Handbook, Speech Language, and Hearing Service Providers addresses reimbursement for the correct units. It states in part:

Most speech therapy is billed using a "per visit" or "per session" code. All activities to treat a participant for communication and/or auditory processing disorders on a specific date, fall under the one "per visit" code. Idaho follows the national correct coding guidelines, which indicate that only one unit of speech therapy can be billed for a given patient on a given day. (See the Medicaid NCCI information on www.medicaid.gov.) If more than one unit of a service can be billed on a given day, the time will be specified in the code description. See the custom fee schedule on the Medicaid Fee Schedules website.

Additional information regarding National Correct Coding Initiative (NCCI) edits can be found in the <u>Medicaid NCCI Policy Manual</u> and Section 2 of Idaho Medicaid Provider Handbook, Speech, Language, and Hearing Service Providers.

Providers should refer to the code definition in the American Medical Association (AMA) code book to determine if the correct number units are based on per visit or time. Services billed to Medicaid that do not comply with AMA coding guidelines and NCCI edits may be subject to recoupment and/or civil monetary penalties.

Gestational Agreements Act

The <u>Gestational Agreements Act</u> passed by the Idaho Legislature will create judicial and legislative oversight of the surrogacy industry in Idaho. Effective July 1, 2023, the legislation prohibits a prospective gestational carrier from receiving public assistance as defined by section <u>56-201</u>, Idaho Code, which includes Idaho Medicaid.

For the purposes of this Act, a gestational carrier is an adult woman who:

- Becomes pregnant or agrees to become pregnant under the terms of a gestational agreement; or
- Gives birth or intends to give birth to a child under the terms to a child under the terms of a gestational agreement; and
- Neither the gestational carrier nor her spouse has contributed or intends to contribute gametes for use in assisted reproduction under the gestational agreement.

The legislation requires the gestational agreement to include all reasonable healthcare expenses associated with the gestational agreement. Providers are required to collect payment from all responsible third parties per the Third Party Liability section of the <u>General Billing Instructions</u>, Idaho Medicaid Handbook, prior to billing Medicaid.

Services for gestational carriers must be billed with the ICD-10 diagnosis code Z33.3 for all pregnancy and delivery-related claims. Claims for these services will be denied and the provider can follow the process for billing the participant for non-covered services per the Participant Financial Responsibility section of the <u>General Information and Requirements for Providers</u>, Idaho Medicaid Handbook.

Claims not for pregnancy or delivery-related services with diagnosis Z33.3 should be submitted with documentation supporting that the service was not related to the gestational agreement. These claims will be pended and reviewed by the Department to determine eligibility for reimbursement.

Idaho Law Requirements for Guardianships/Conservatorships

The following impacts signature requirements for all documents related to Adult Developmental Disability (DD) services, including application, assessment, and plan/addendum submission and prior authorization.

Idaho law requires that all guardianships and conservatorships have been issued by an Idaho court, transferred from another court with jurisdiction accepted by Idaho, or registered in the Idaho state courts. If the guardianship or conservatorship originated in another state (foreign guardianship/conservatorship), Idaho law requires it be registered or transferred with an Idaho court assuming jurisdiction. This is referenced in Title 15, Chapter 13, Parts 3 and 4 of Idaho Code. In order to ensure all actions that are taken by the Department are legal and enforceable, the following will apply to all individuals in the Adult DD program who have a foreign guardianship/conservatorship:

- Guardians/conservators holding foreign guardianships/conservatorships must register and/or transfer that guardianship/conservatorship to Idaho courts.
- Participants with foreign guardianship/conservatorship must sign all documents that require signature until the foreign guardianship has been registered and/or transferred to Idaho courts.

Additionally, in guardianships/conservatorships issued to more than one guardian/conservator (i.e. co-guardianship/co-conservatorship), the use of "and" or "or" in the order dictates which party(ies) signature is required. When "and" is used, all guardians/conservators must sign on behalf of the ward. When "or" is used, signature by either co-guardian/co-conservator will suffice.

Vision Therapy Coding

Idaho Medicaid is updating billing requirements for vision therapy to accommodate changes in national coding that include the new CPT[®] code, 92066. The new code is available effective January 1, 2023, for vision therapy under Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) services. Idaho Medicaid will now use CPT[®] 92065 only for physicians, ophthalmologists, and optometrists and 92066 for occupational and physical therapists. The Medical Care Unit prior authorizes both codes.

Providers with existing authorizations will continue to bill using the codes on those authorizations for the service regardless of which allowed provider type provided the service. New requests, however, will need to identify if the request is for 92065 and/or 92066 and how many units are being requested for each.

Molecular Pathology for Infants

Idaho Medicaid is updating prior authorization requirements for CPT[®] codes 81329, 81403, 81406 and 81479. These codes will be allowed without a prior authorization for newborns from birth to 120 days of life when billed with the EP modifier.

June 2023 Changes to the APC Prep – Fee Schedule Paid Procedure Codes List

The <u>APC Prep – Fee Schedule Paid Procedure Codes</u> list has been updated to include procedure codes that were inaccurately removed from the May 2023 list. Except for instate Critical Access Hospitals (CAH), Institutions for Mental Disease (IMDs) and State-Owned Hospitals, acute care hospitals will continue to be required to bill a CPT or HCPCS code on each outpatient hospital claim line where procedure codes are required under national billing guidelines.

Changes to QIO Prior Authorization and Post Payment Review Submission Procedures

Effective August 1st, 2023, all Idaho Medicaid providers, submitting prior authorization requests or uploading medical records for post payment medical necessity and DRG validation reviews to the Quality Improvement Organization (QIO), must use the Provider Portal that is provided by the QIO (Telligen).

Starting August 1st, 2023, all providers are required to submit prior authorization requests to Telligen via the online Qualitrac Portal. Faxed, mailed, or called in requests will no longer be accepted.

Starting August 1st, 2023, all providers are required to upload requested medical records for post payment Medical Necessity reviews and DRG validation reviews via the online Qualitrac Portal. Faxed, mailed, or medical records submitted to other portals (CIOX, MRO, Share Care, etc.). will no longer be accepted.

Telligen will be hosting a series of provider training sessions for those not already using Qualitrac. Telligen will post training information on their website and send letters to the mailing address indicated in the MMIS.

It is recommended that providers attend at least one training offered by Telligen in each of the following topic areas:

- Portal Registration Training
- Submitting a Portal Request
- Uploading Records for Post Payment Cases

If you are unable to do so, you may follow this process to register for the Qualitrac portal:

• If you are not sure whether or not a code requires prior authorization or who reviews the code, please view the most updated Idaho Medicaid Numerical Fee Schedule found on the "For Providers" website.

While we strongly recommend all providers to create an account in the portal, if for some reason you are unable to access the portal, you may appeal directly to Idaho Medicaid to continue to alternative avenues for submitted prior authorization requests and submitted medical record requests. Please email any appeal request to <u>MedicaidQIO@dhw.idaho.gov</u>. IDHW will notify Telligen of all providers that are an exception to this process.

If you are unable to access Qualitrac, you may submit a request for an exception to this policy to <u>MedicaidQIO@dhw.idaho.gov</u>.

Subject: COVID-19 Medicaid Flexibilities Under The Public Health Emergency

The <u>Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023</u> set the end of what is known as COVID-19 Medicaid Protection as April 1, 2023. Please see <u>Department FAQs</u>. The Department began processing re-evaluations of all individuals who are receiving Medicaid coverage under this protection beginning in February. This process will occur in phases every month through fall 2023.

Starting April 1, a person's Medicaid will discontinue if they are ineligible. When this happens, they will receive a notice from the Department that details their household's Medicaid eligibility results.

The <u>Secretary of Health and Human Services (HHS)</u> has declared the end of the federal public health emergency (PHE) as May 11, 2023. For how that affects Medicaid policy flexibilities, please see <u>Medicaid Participant</u> and <u>Medicaid Provider</u> FAQs. Policy flexibilities were put in place to address dynamic conditions at the height of the pandemic that affected the ability of people to access services. Many flexibilities, such as group sizes, or delaying assessments and service plans, will return to normal operations.

Implementation Status of Highly Anticipated Flexibility Updates

Telehealth: In general, for Idaho Medicaid, if services can be provided safely and effectively, telehealth will continue to be an option.

- Audio-only telehealth will also continue, with some refinements over time.
- Services delivered via telehealth will continue to pay at parity.
- Providers need to identify the location of the participant at the time of service as the Place of Service (POS) on all claims. Place of Service (POS) 02 for telehealth is not used by Idaho Medicaid.

Providers are expected to follow the policies outlined in the <u>Idaho Medicaid Provider</u> <u>Handbook</u> unless otherwise stated in a published <u>Medicaid Information Release</u>.

Subject: Change in Provider Reimbursement Rates

The State Fiscal Year 2023 amended budget request from the Department was approved by the legislature and signed by the Governor on April 4, 2023.

The Medicaid providers listed will receive a change to their reimbursement rates for the codes below as soon as the system is updated. System changes are projected to be completed by the end of the month.

Any claims submitted for services rendered on or after April 1, 2023 must be reprocessed for the new reimbursement rate to show up on a provider's remittance advice (RA). Medicaid's new rates are approved for both fee-for-service (Gainwell Technologies (GWT)) and managed care (Blue Cross of Idaho and Molina Healthcare of Idaho's Medicare Medicaid Coordinated Plan (MMCP) and Idaho Medicaid Plus (IM Plus)) participants.

Fee for service and managed care providers should expect rate increases on a provider's RA to show up in June 2023. Certain claims submitted by providers will be reprocessed without need for provider actions. Certified Family Homes providing care for participants on the Aged & Disabled waiver must take an action. Please see page 3 of this information release for details. Reprocessing claims will take time. Please allow fee for service and managed care contracts at least 60 calendar days to complete this activity before contacting claims processing representatives.

Subject: Update regarding flexibilities given for PCS care by spouse/parents during the Public Health Emergency

Certain flexibilities in federal rules have been granted to state Medicaid Agencies for the duration of the Public Health Emergency (PHE), effectively declared by the Secretary of Health and Human Services (HHS) in January of 2020. These flexibilities were intended to support access to services that may have otherwise become available.

One of those flexibilities has been the temporary waiving of a federal regulation [<u>42 C.F.R. §</u> <u>440.167 Personal Care Services</u>], which prohibits certain individuals from being compensated by a state Medicaid Agency for providing personal care services (PCS) to a Medicaid participant, primarily certain family members. In Idaho, this is specific to spouses of participants and parents of minor children who are participants.

This emergency flexibility granted during the PHE expired on May 11, 2023 (<u>per HHS</u>). The Department has heard from families asking for a continuance of the increased flexibility for Personal Care Services and Attendant Care Services.

The Department now has federal authority to extend the ability to pay parents and spouses as caregivers through November 11, 2023.

The Department is researching and pursuing several options to extend the flexibility permanently while addressing complicated regulatory challenges. The Department hopes to have a solution identified soon that would allow for parents of minor children and spouses to care for their loved ones in extraordinary circumstances.


