Maintenance of Contact Information

The Medicaid Program Integrity Unit has found instances where providers moved, changed mailing addresses, or changed telephone numbers without informing the Department to update the information. It is required that any time there is a change to the provider record, the provider must update the Medicaid Management Information System (MMIS).

Some common changes providers must update with the Department include, but are not limited to:

- Physical and Mailing Addresses
- Service Locations
- Telephone Numbers
- Change of Ownership/Controlling Interest
- Adding or Removing Rendering Providers
- Adding or Removing Service Providers from your Roster

Section 5.8 of the Idaho Medicaid Provider Handbook, General Information and Requirements for Providers, addresses maintenance of contact information and states:

5.8. Maintenance of Contact Information

Providers shall notify the Department of any changes to the information contained in the Enrollment Application, including but not limited to their mailing address and service locations, within 30 days of the date of the change. The Department is required by Federal regulations to terminate a provider's enrollment for failure to submit timely and correct information, which may also affect the provider's enrollment in other states' Medicaid programs. The Department may allow a provider to keep their enrollment if it documents in writing that termination would not be in the best interests of the Medicaid program. Failure to keep information current may also result in recoupment and civil or monetary penalties.

All correspondence sent to the mailing address on file with the State's fiscal agent shall be deemed to be received by the Provider. Department correspondence will not be forwarded by a change of address with the U.S. Postal Service. See the Provider File Updates subsection for instructions on updating contact information.

Idaho Medicaid Aims to Improve Safety through Benzodiazepine Utilization Management

- New benzodiazepine prescriptions limited to 2 weeks.
- All alprazolam prescriptions require prior authorization.

Benzodiazepine (BZD) use can lead to physical dependence, overdose and death; cognitive decline; falls and fractures; and multiple negative psychological effects. BZDs are only rarely indicated in the treatment of behavioral health conditions and sometimes, such as in PTSD, can even make symptoms worse. That said and despite their risks, BZD utilization in Idaho and

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around the country remains high. To decrease overreliance on BZDs, Idaho Medicaid is now limiting new fills to two (2) weeks and prior authorizing higher risk BZDs, including alprazolam. In the near future, all BZD prescriptions will require prior authorization.

Key Ways to Improve BZD Safety:

- Use BZDs sparingly-the lowest dose for the shortest time: Even two weeks of BZDs can lead to tolerance, dependence, and adverse effects.
- Set clear expectations: Discuss risks, stopping parameters, and discontinuation plan when first starting a BZD (keeping in mind that dependence may develop even after a few weeks of daily use and a taper may be needed).
- Obtain a second opinion: Consult psychiatry early and often. Consider bringing cases to <u>Project ECHO Idaho</u>'s Behavioral Health in Primary Care series.
- Limit prescribers: One prescriber should ideally be responsible for all controlled substance prescribing. If this is not possible, coordinate closely with other prescribers.
- Drug test sometimes: Urine drug testing should be done intermittently to confirm adherence. Quantitative (confirmatory) urine drug testing is typically needed to identify most BZDs.
- Dispose of unused BZDs: Require return of unused BZDs for new prescriptions. Many pharmacies have <u>drug disposals</u>.

Idaho Medicaid Support:

- Emergency Fills: If you have a prior authorization pending and your patient needs their medication urgently, the pharmacy can fill a 72-hour emergency supply. The override codes for billing a 72-hour emergency supply at the pharmacy are:
 - Reason for Service code: TP (Payer/processor questions)
 - Professional Service code: MR (Medication review)
 - Result for Service code: 1F (Filled, with a different quantity)
- Tapering & Discontinuation: Taper planning should be individualized and typically slow and gradual. In many cases, decreasing the dose by one tablet per month is appropriate.

Subject: Speech-Language Pathology Assistants (SLP-A) Rate Adjustment

The Department of Health and Welfare has authorized an adjustment for Speech-Language Pathology (SLP) Assistants provided in a School-Based Services (SBS) setting effective July 1, 2024. The rate will be set at 85% of the current Speech-Language Pathology (Professional) rate. This adjustment aims to align the rates for SLP Assistants with those of Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy assistants.

Any claims submitted for services rendered on or after July 1, 2024, using the old rate must be reprocessed for the new rate to show up on the SBS provider's remittance advice (RA). Claims submitted by SBS providers will be reprocessed without need for provider actions.

Effective July 1, 2024, the new rates for Speech-Language Pathology Assistants will be as follows:


